Quick Facts

- In 1972, Rosemount Center was created to carry on the work of the House of Mercy, the oldest existing Episcopal charity in the Diocese of Washington, by providing early childhood education, helping families, and building a strong community.
- Rosemount Center received its first Head Start grant in 1986 and its first Early Head Start grant in 1996.
- Rosemount Center provides early childhood education and family support services to pregnant women, infants, and preschool-aged children and their families in its center-based and home-based programs.
- Thousands of children ages 0-5 and their families have been helped by Rosemount Center, which serves as a vital source of dual language early childhood education and support services.
- Rosemount Center is one of the most socio-economically diverse early childhood centers in the area.
